

Constitution of Faith

2 Timothy 3:16

All scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:

Proverbs 9:1

Wisdom hath builded her house, she hath hewn out her seven pillars:

Ephesians 4:4-6

- *There is* one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling;
 - One Lord, one faith, one baptism,
- One God and Father of all, who *is* above all, and through all, and in you all.

There are seven "ones" listed in the above passage. They are explained as follows:

1. One Body is His church, the bride.
2. One Spirit is the Spirit of God, the Creator.
3. One Hope is one future and that future through the baptism of the Spirit of God by redemption through the innocent Blood of Christ, shed on the cross of Calvary.
4. One Lord who is God in the flesh of the man Jesus Christ
5. One Faith is the work that Jesus did on the cross. This work was the destruction and finishing of sin.
6. One Baptism is the baptism into the body of Christ by repentance and the washing away of sin by the water and the Blood.
7. One God and Father who is the Father of all living and without Him nothing was made that was made.

Hebrews 6:1-2

- Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God,
 - Of the doctrine of baptisms, and of laying on of hands, and of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.

There are seven principles to the Apostles' Doctrine which is the Doctrine of Christ. They are explained as follows:

1. Repentance, which was the first commandment when men questioned how to be saved found in the second chapter of the book of Acts
2. Faith toward God by the belief in the work of Christ
3. Baptism by immersion in water for the remission of sins
4. Baptism of fire which is the spirit of God dwelling in us, the initial sign by tongues and the evidence by the characteristic lifestyle of Christ in our daily walk with Him
5. Laying on of hands, meaning those things of which the ministry approves or disapproves
6. Resurrection of the dead on the Last Day being all that are in the graves shall rise; the dead in Christ first and the dead in sin directly afterward – but all rise on the same day: the Last Day
7. Eternal judgment being the final judgment of sin and the casting of all who are wicked, including Satan, the old dragon, into the lake of fire, which is the second death.

1 Timothy 3:16

And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was immediately after the tribulation of those days shall the sun be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken:
• And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory.

This revelation is given to the children of obedience. John 2:20 which states, "But ye have an unction from the Holy One, and ye know all things." Ephesians 1:17 declares: "That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him:"

We are further instructed of this truth in Psalm 25:14. "The secret of the LORD is with them that fear him; and he will shew them his covenant." According to Revelation 10:7 which states, "But in the days of the voice of the seventh angel, when he shall begin to sound, the mystery of God should be finished, as he hath declared to his servants the prophets." This seventh event, which is His second coming, concludes the "mystery. manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.

Six events are listed in this verse but one event has not occurred: the second coming of Christ. The return of Christ is the seventh event, which occurs immediately after tribulation, as noted in Matthew 24:29-30.*"

1 Corinthians 2: 10-16

- But God hath revealed *them* unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God.
 - For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God.
 - Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.
 - Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual.
 - But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know *them*, because they are spiritually discerned.
 - But he that is spiritual judgeth all things, yet he himself is judged of no man.
 - For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ.
- Man in his first nature, which is the human will/an antichrist mindset, cannot know the mind of Christ. But the repentant man, with the Spirit of God dwelling in him, in daily repentance, is in the mind of Christ and can know all things.
